### Project update

#### Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over four years to deliver more than 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

#### Wentworthville Public School

A project is underway to upgrade Wentworthville Public School. The project will deliver:

- 31 new permanent learning spaces
- a new hall and library
- a new special education area
- new administration and staff facilities
- new special program rooms.

#### Project summary

The State Significant Development application has been approved by the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment and the detailed design is being finalised.

The construction contractor has completed site establishment works and demolition works have begun.

#### Next steps

The contractor has completed site establishment for the first stage of the project. Next steps include:

- bulk earthworks
- complete demolition
- in-ground service works
- completion of detailed design
- tower crane installation.

## Frequently asked questions

### When will construction be completed?

The project will be delivered in three stages, and is scheduled for completion in mid 2021.

### What safety measures are in place?

The safety of the school's students, staff and the local community is our highest priority.

Construction planning has been designed so there is minimal impact on school operations. Safety measures such as hoardings, signage and separate access points are in place to ensure students are not able to enter the construction site.

To minimise disruption to school operations and activities, site deliveries are being scheduled outside of school drop off and pick up times and traffic control personnel are on site to assist with contractor deliveries.

### How is contaminated material managed during construction?

The health, safety and well-being of students, staff and neighbours is our highest priority. Any contaminated or potentially hazardous materials will be managed and remediated in accordance with the applicable legislation, standards and guidelines.

Any asbestos containing material will be managed in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan and Safe Work NSW by licensed asbestos removalists and occupational hygienists in strict accordance with all applicable legislation, regulations, policies and guidelines.

Please be aware that any works involving contaminated material will pose no risk to staff, students or the local community. Prior to work commencing, notifications will be issued to the community.

### What are the scheduled work hours?

Work will take place during approved hours between 7am and 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am and 1pm on Saturdays.

### Will there be changes to how the school is accessed?

To enable construction to run smoothly and safely the below changes will be in place:

- Fullagar Road – Gates 3, 4 and 5 will be closed
- Station Street – Gate 6 will be closed
- Monash Street – Gate 7 will be used as the Temporary OSHC gate

All other gates are available to use as per normal.

### How will traffic be managed?

Construction vehicle movements and deliveries will be scheduled outside of peak school operation times.

Traffic management will be in place where required to manage vehicles entering and exiting the site in a safe manner.

### How will you keep us informed during construction?

School infrastructure NSW will continue to share construction updates and project information as the project progresses. We will keep the school and local community informed through project notifications, information booths, school newsletters, drop-in sessions and website updates.

### How will you minimise disruption to normal school operations during construction?

School Infrastructure NSW is working closely with the principal and staff to ensure that school operations continue with minimal disruption.
