Uniform Review Results Summary

Updating Boys' Shirts for summer and winter uniform

The Wentworthville PS Uniform Review Committee have been working diligently over the last few months and are thankful for your feedback in the recent Survey Monkey. The committee, chaired by Mrs Grant (a parent) have reviewed all responses and read through results. A summary of feedback is outlined below.

- 78% of parents surveyed indicated they would like a logo on the new boys' summer and winter shirts
- The top three things for consideration when purchasing a uniform were: cost effectiveness, comfort and looking smart.
- What were the key themes that were important regarding boys summer uniform shirt? looking smart, logo, cost effectiveness, short sleeves, ease of care of garment, no white, cotton mix for comfort during summer
- What were the key themes that were important regarding boys winter uniform shirt? looking smart, logo, cost effectiveness, long sleeves, ease of care of garment, no white, suitable during winter
- Some general comments talked about: low fade of colours, no ironing required (drip /dry), easy to purchase and complement girls' colour in uniform.

Consultation is also occurring with students, and teachers in the coming weeks to ensure we capture thoughts, expectations and concerns. I met with the school captains today outlining how we will be consulting with the student body and gaining their feedback about the boys' shirts for summer and winter.

Next Steps:

- Sample Boys shirts on display Term 4 Weeks 1-3 in the front office and demonstrated at a few morning assemblies.
- Voting on Boys' shirts Term 4: Weeks 4 and 5. By end of week 5 a determination from gathered data made by Uniform Review Committee. Community will be notified of outcome choice via newsletter.
- Order placed with suppliers for a delivery early February 2019. All 2019 Kindergarten boys, new enrolments and existing families will have the opportunity of purchasing the new boys' summer shirt from 2019. The Uniform shop volunteers will keep us informed on stock arrival. As with any uniform change there is a transition period and we would ask parents to purchase the new boys shirt in due course.

We really appreciate you taking the time to fill out the survey that we sent out last term regarding uniforms. We have read through and discussed all of your responses and are looking to choose a new boys summer and winter shirt which will work best for everyone involved.

We have selected three different sample shirts and we would love to hear which one you like best.

There will be a flyer go out to children this week. We will also have the samples available for your viewing in the school office and some of the children will model them in morning assemblies in Weeks 1, 2 and 3.

In Weeks 4 and 5, you will be able to choose which style you like best in a survey. More details about that to follow.

Option 1 Grey collared and button up shirt with school logo



Option 2 Black and grey polo with school logo



Option 3 White collared and button up shirt with school logo

The style chosen will be available to purchase in both short and long sleeve versions.

Approximate cost will be \$28-\$30 per shirt

The voted for shirt will be worn in summer with short sleeve (4 days on non-sport days) and with the grey shorts for boys. The winter version will be the same style but in a long sleeve version and worn with the long grey pants for boys (4 days on non-sport days).

NB -Sport days will see the unisex sport uniform worn (Black / White polo and black shorts – this is already a part of the uniform suite)








Travelling or taking holidays during the school term

Since 2015 family holidays and travel are no longer considered under the exemption from school procedures. Travel outside of the vacation period is now counted as an absence for statistical purposes.

Parents are required to complete the application for extended leave, which is available from the school office and website. This form must be submitted at the front office prior to travel for principal consideration.



The principal will not accept a reason for travel during the school term if it is not in the best interests of the student. Educational, social and participation reasons should be specified on the application.

Travel is considered to be domestic or international travel for the purpose of a family holiday, family business, bereavement or other reasons, which should be specified on the application.

If the principal considers that the travel is appropriate during the school term, the principal will inform the parent if the application is accepted. The absences will then be recorded as 'L"- Leave. The absences will be recorded on your child's report.

All travel documentation, such as travel itinerary or e-ticket must be attached to the application.

The principal may decline an application for Extended Leave -Travel and the parent will be informed of this in writing. The absence will then be recorded as unjustified and will appear on your child's report.





Five forgotten skill sets that contribute to student success

At a time when we hear a great deal about growth mindsets, good mental health habits and creating digitally savvy students, we can easily overlook the skill sets that form the building blocks of long-term school success. These are skill sets that are also easily forgotten when we narrow our focus onto numeracy, literacy, performing arts, STEM and other academic areas.

While all these other mental skills and academic areas are important, the skills I want to focus on here are ones that can be taught, or at the very least drawn out, alongside every other skill when we as parents and teachers know what to look for.

Following are five skill sets that contribute massively to overall student success and contentedness at school.

1. Friendship skills

The ability to get along with others is hugely important for children and teenagers. Those students with a strong set of friendship skills are easy to like, easy to relate to and easy to play with. The skills they possess include knowing how to win and lose well, how to approach others to join in a group and how to lead rather than boss.



The ability to organise your time, your space, your items and other aspects of your life is a massive plus for any student. The best way to help children who



are organisationally challenged is to introduce them to systems and processes to help them organise themselves. These processes include the use of visual reminders, anchoring (i.e. linking new behaviours to habitual behaviours) and the mapping out of activities.

3. Optimism skills

It may seem strange to see optimism as skill set, but as leading psychologist Professor Martin Seligman discovered through his research, optimism can be taught. Seligman found that while some children are more inclined by nature to see a glass as half empty than half full, all children are capable of developing an optimistic explanatory style through exposure and direct teaching. The skills of optimism include being aware of self-talk, reframing negative events into positive events and the practice of perspective-taking.

4. Coping skills

Kids will generally face a number of challenges during the course of their school lives including overcoming the disappointment of not being picked on a team, working their way through difficult learning situations and dealing with rejection. The impact of these challenges will depend on each kid's own spirit, the support they receive and their coping skills. The good news is that coping skills can be taught or, at the very least, encouraged if adults know what to focus on. Coping strategies include parking problems for a while, normalising difficult situations and accepting and moving on. Some kids will use coping strategies quite naturally, while others need parental and teacher input to help them cope with even seemingly minor challenges.

5. Relaxation skills

The ability to relax and get away from it all is vital for the maintenance of mental health, which in turn affects a student's ability to perform. Many of today's kids live with pressure. That pressure needs to be released through relaxation and play, otherwise it can lead to anxiety and other mental illnesses. The ability to relax and unwind is paramount to your child's school



success. Relaxation techniques include mindfulness and meditation, participating in hobbies and enjoying creative pursuits.

These skills are part developmental and part environmental. That is, kids will naturally develop many of them as they mature but the skills also need to be nurtured environmentally. They need to be recognised, encouraged, taught and modelled by adults who children and teenagers respect and admire. That makes parents and teachers 'Very Important People' in the process of acquiring them.
