



Once you sign in you will be taken to the Bookshelf.

Search for a book three ways.

- Scroll along the toolbar to select a book by category.
- Swipe left and right in a category to see all books related to that category.
- Search for a book using the search box. Let's find the book called Energy from the Building Block of Science series.

Tap on Q. Type Energy in the search box, tap on the dropdown arrow and tick the Book Title box. Tap Search, Tap on the Energy cover.

Tap DOWNLOAD.



You don't have to be connected to the internet to read downloaded titles. Just tap on the Downloaded category next time you login to the eBooks app.

Sign out when you've finished. If left open, your session will eventually 'expire' and you will be prompted to re-login for security purposes.

ENROLMENTS

Enrolling with OSHClub is easy and completely free, just head to our website oshclub.com.au and click register. Your child's enrolment must be confirmed before attending their first session with us.

BOOKINGS & CANCELLATIONS

Once enrolled, you can manage your bookings and cancellations with ease online or via the Kidsoft app.

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Bookings can be made online any time up to 24 hours before the session commences. To make a booking after this time, please contact your service directly on 0417 806 673. Late bookings will incur an additional \$4.00 fee.

To avoid any out of pocket costs, cancellations must be made at least 48 hours in advance. Cancellations within this period will incur the full fee, less any applicable CCS.

SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

Vacation Care bookings can be made online up to 5 days before the session commences. To make a booking after this time, please contact your service directly on 0417 806 673. Late bookings will incur an additional \$4.00 fee.

To avoid any out of pocket costs, cancellations must be made at least 7 days in advance. Cancellations within this period will incur the full fee, less any applicable CCS.

CHILD CARE SUBSIDY

Many families are eligible for Child Care Subsidy (CCS), which can reduce the cost of Outside School Hours Care by up to 85%. All our services are CCS approved, so we encourage all families to find out whether they are eligible. To establish what level of CCS you may be entitled to please contact the Centrelink Family Line on 13 61 50.

STATEMENTS & PAYMENTS

Fees will be automatically debited every 2 weeks in arrears from the bank account, VISA or MasterCard you nominated during enrolment. Please note that if a transaction is declined, a dishonour fee will be applied. You can view your statements via your online account.

LATE PICK-UP

A \$1.00 per minute, per child fee may apply for children picked up after the service close time.

NO SHOW

An additional \$5.00 fee per child may be charged for any After School Care booking where no cancellation is provided.

INCURSIONS & EXCURSIONS

Incursions and excursions may incur an additional fee. These vary based on activity and may be subject to change.

MEDICAL MANAGEMENT

So we can provide the best and safest care, it is important that you inform the service if your child/ren has an identified health care need, allergy or relevant medical condition diagnosed by a registered medical practitioner. On your first day of attendance, bring along a completed Risk Minimisation form, Medical Management forms and any required medications. All medications (including ointments and creams) must be prescribed by a medical practitioner, be in the original container with original pharmacist labels and clear instructions. All labels must be legible and undamaged, and the medication must still be within its expiry date.

INSIGHTS

Helping your child become the best student they can be



The new school year is full of excitement and possibility for students and parents. Regardless of how a child or young person has previously performed, this year offers a chance to set a new course.

While it's tempting as a parent to make the attainment of good academic results the main priority, this is a narrow view that may be incompatible with long-term success. It's wiser to broaden your view and focus on helping your child or young person become the best student they can be. Here's how.

Encourage learning

The rapidly changing world and workforce that your child will enter requires that they have a willingness to continually learn and adapt. The concept of a lifelong learner, previously lauded by educators with an eye to the future, has now become a reality. Learning and continual improvement should be embedded in each child's psyche so that school life is just a starting point to a lifetime of learning, growth and development. Help your child see themselves as successful learners who achieve results through hard work and application, and that nothing is beyond them if they apply themselves.

Promote leadership

Leadership is required in all walks of life including at school, at work, in families and in the wider community. Help your child see themselves as a leader by focusing on personal leadership capacities such as planning ahead, communicating clearly, being accountable for their behaviour, developing emotional awareness and fostering good relationships with siblings and peers. Personal leadership development provides a strong foundation for the development of leadership skills in more public forums in later life.

Applaud independence

The school years are critical for the development of independence, which can easily be closed down by the roadblocks of impatience, overindulgence, fear and lack of time. Alternatively, independence is promoted when we show patience, provide opportunity, display confidence and teach students how.

Embed wellbeing

If there is one difference that modern schooling is making to the next generation it's in the leadership they have shown in recent years to the maintenance of mental health and wellbeing practises. Parents can support their child's long term wellbeing by embedding wellbeing habits including healthy eating, exercise, sleep, relaxation techniques, regular time in nature, gratitude and mindfulness.



Teach socialisation

If you want your child to be liked by others, it's essential to spend time and effort developing the skills and attitudes needed to succeed. Develop in them an awareness of how their behaviour impacts on others, instil manners and community-mindedness and develop a broad range of friendship skills that will assist them to relate well to others.

Foster resilience

2020 showed us life is unpredictable, full of ups and downs, straight balls and curve balls. It's the unpredictability, the downs and the curve balls that develop kids' resilience. How parents and teachers react to the hardships, frustrations and difficulties kids face either hamper or foster resilience. Spoil, overprotect or pamper and growth opportunities are wasted. Support, encourage and teach kids to cope and you'll be helping them develop a real sense of psychological hardiness and resilience that's essential for long term happiness and success.

Make this year a memorable one by helping your child grow and develop into the best student they can be. Keep the focus broad and do all you can to ensure that your child sees themselves as a confident and continuous learner.
